Member Spotlight: Financial Services Information Sharing and Analysis Center (FS-ISAC)

This Member Spotlight highlight the Financial Services Information Sharing and Analysis Center (FS-ISAC). We interviewed Susan Rogers, Director of Business Resiliency at FS-ISAC. Thank you Susan for taking the time to share more about the FS-ISAC.

What community does the FS-ISAC serve and how many members are currently in your partnership?

The FS-ISAC includes over 6,000 participating firms within the financial services industry, across all areas of the financial services sector throughout the world, including banks, brokerage firms, community institutions, card companies, insurance companies, payment and clearing processors, associations, and financial sector service providers.

How and when was the FS-ISAC formed?

The Financial Services Information Sharing and Analysis Center (FS-ISAC), formed in 1999, is a global member-owned, non-profit private financial sector initiative. It was designed and developed by its member institutions. Its primary function is to share timely, relevant, and actionable physical and cybersecurity threat and incident information to enhance the ability of the financial services sector to prepare for, respond to, and mitigate risks associated with these threats.

How has your partnership advanced critical infrastructure protection in your community?

FS-ISAC facilitates the development of professional and trusted relationships among peers and subject matter experts to protect member firms and the critical infrastructure across the financial services sector. This allows information to be shared and threats to be combatted from all angles, providing for collaboration among various types of organizations with the overall goal of working together to protect the sector as a whole. FS-ISAC is uniquely positioned to quickly disseminate physical and cyber threat alerts and other critical information to organizations across the world.



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What exciting or innovative partnership programs or initiatives are you currently involved with?

- **All-Hazards Crisis Response Playbook Update & Sector Crisis Response Exercising**—The newly revised version of the FS-ISAC All-Hazards Crisis Response Playbook was rolled-out in Q4 2015. The revised document has been reduced to 10 pages and is supplemented with a series of resource guides that contain more detailed instructions to support specific crisis response activities. The goal of the 2015 revision is to create a streamlined document that will be used in exercises, awareness activities and during crisis events. Planning is underway for a series of 2016 Playbook specific exercises and to utilize the document in sector level exercises during 2016.
- **Spreading Awareness of the Value of Information Sharing & Communities of Interest**—Members of FS-ISAC may join various standing committees that meet regularly to provide strategic guidance, industry context, and subject matter expertise. These groups are specialized communities of interest where SME's can build peer relationships in a trusted environment. Value to members includes the following:
 - * Your Firm will know how to **connect into sector response activities**;
 - * **Verify the facts of a crisis** for media communication;
 - * Leaders in your firm will **build trusted relationships** with their peers and tap into them during a crisis event;
 - * **Share mitigation strategies – FAST!**

The FS-ISAC's strategic plan for 2016 focuses on:

- Growing the membership globally to expand support for financial institutions of all types and sizes
- Enhancing analysis of current and emerging threats
- Expanding and implementing security automation (via Soltra)
- Expanding cyber exercises to include sector-wide exercises (including one for CEOs in October), regional exercises around the US, and for payment processors
- Assisting other sectors with information sharing infrastructure, and deepening existing relationships with retailers, legal services, energy, health care, and real estate sectors
- Supporting the development of regional FIRST coalitions
- Expanding education programs and networking events including summits in Miami, Nashville, Barcelona, and Singapore

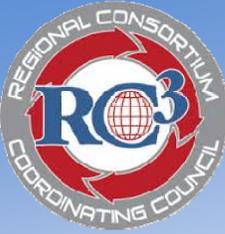

Successful JCIP Webinar Series on Drones Attracts Thousands

In March, Regional Consortium Coordinating Council (RC3) Vice Chair, Tom Moran, facilitated a three-part Joint Critical Infrastructure Partnership (JCIP) Webinar Series on “Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAV)/Drones...Hovering Friends or Foes?” in conjunction with the State, Local, Tribal and Territorial Government Coordinating Council (SLTTGCC) and the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Office of Infrastructure Protection.

Over 1,200 critical infrastructure stakeholders from across the country participated in the webinar series representing public and private sectors. The topics included:

- *Drone Technology* which highlighter the cost and risks associated with drone technology development,
- *Drone Use Cases, Threats and Deterrents* which focused on the adoption of drones in the electricity sector and the current issues related to its use, and;
- *Drone Policy, Barriers and Recommendations* which targeted on the regulatory aspect of drones when it comes to security and privacy in the public and private sectors.

Participants valued the applicability and usefulness of the information, describing them as “awesome presentations”. Two other attendees professed, “I learned more in this webinar than all week”, and “These have been great webinars. I hope they can continue”.

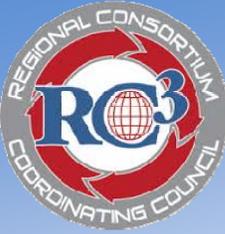
DHS is accepting applications for the Loaned Executive Program

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NIPP Security and Resilience Challenge

Have an innovative idea on how to improve the security or resilience of infrastructure in your community? Apply to the NIPP Security and Resilience Challenge and your idea could receive funding.

The National Infrastructure Protection Plan (NIPP) Security and Resilience Challenge, a Department of Homeland Security (DHS) program, identifies and funds high priority innovative projects among the critical infrastructure community. The Challenge has approximately \$3 million available in FY 2016 to fund around ten high-priority sector and regional innovation initiatives. These initiatives will develop technology, tools, processes, and methods that address near-term needs and further strengthen the security and resilience of critical infrastructure.

To apply for Challenge funds, DHS is asking its NIPP partners to submit Capability Gap Statements to describe how their project will fill gaps in cyber and physical security, first responder needs, and other capabilities. Capability Gap Statements will be reviewed and vetted by the National Institute for Hometown Security in a competitive process. DHS Office of Infrastructure Protection (IP) will then make final decisions on which Capability Gap Statements will be advanced to the proposal phase.

Capability Gap Statements can be submitted electronically at The [National Institute of Hometown Security \(NIHS\) website](#). Only submissions received by **5 p.m. EDT on Friday, April 8, 2016**, will be accepted.



DHS is also requesting volunteers to serve on the review panel.
